


# NAMASTA SURVEY REVEALS HEALING ARTS PROFESSIONALS ARE ALSO CONCERNED ABOUT THEIR HEALTH CARE COVERAGE

### October 2004

NAMASTA released a survey about health care needs sent to 1182 healing arts professionals in the United States. NAMASTA, the North American Studio Alliance is a membership organization that serves the business needs of healing arts, mind-body, bodywork professionals in the United States and Canada.



Over a quarter of healing arts professionals surveyed do not have traditional health care coverage, which is a higher proportion than the US average. Two factors can help explain this:

- 1. Many healing arts professionals are low-income independent contractors or small businesses that cannot afford traditional health insurance
- 2. Healing arts professionals tend to live healthier lives than average, their professions have demonstrated preventative benefits and their need for treatment may be less.

## **Demographics**

- 79.1% of respondents said they were currently involved in the ownership or management of a healing arts business or intend to
- 44.0% have employees or are planning to
- The overwhelming majority of healing arts professionals are women

# Methodology

The survey was conducted online between August 12 and September 5, 2004. Respondents included massage and bodywork practitioners, Yoga, Pilates and T'ai Chi teachers and studio owners.
